A TALE OF TWO CITIES



In the red, there's Hangzhou: China's most poetic city, referred to in a popular saying as "heaven on earth". And in the blue corner, there's Nanjing: capital of China for no less than eight dynasties. But who will win? Seconds out, round one!



Nanjing's recently restored Ming Dynastyers city wall is the perfect way to get out and
about in the former capital. To begin, head to
the Taicheng City Wall section, where you'll
find a museum explaining the wall's history
– obtain route recommendations there. For
the shutterbugs, opt for the picturesque
1.5km trail that goes north-west
along the Wall, overlooking
Xuanwu Lake.

ROUND 1: Water, water everywhere

Both cities are defined by the stuff. Nanjing commands a prize perch on the Yangtze, China's greatest river, and the plump ducks from the wetlands are salted, boiled or roasted in restaurants across the city. Xuanwu Lake, once an imperial garden, is overlooked by the remains of Nanjing's mighty city wall.



Similarly, Hangzhou grew rich as the southern terminus of the Grand Canal. But the dreamy expanse of its West Lake, framed by willow trees and rolling hills, is the single most famous body of water in China, inspiring poets and artists for millennia. 'Nuff said'



ROUND 2: Imperial sights



Nanjing, capital of China for eight dynastic periods, has its own unrivalled imperial jewel. Rising up 400m from the foot of Xuanwu Lake, Purple Mountain is a treasure trove of ancient tombs and temples, including the final resting place of the founding emperor of the Ming Dynasty, Zhu Yuanzhana.



Hangzhou was a favourite destination of the Qing emperors, who wandered the shores and causeways of West Lake, picking out the finest views and having them inscribed on stone tablets. One of these is "Moon over the Peaceful Lake in Autumn". Immortalised these views may be, but they're still far off from Nanjing's imperial accents.

ROUND 3: People

Even more fame us roday than the first Ming emperor is Sun Yartsen, whose office can be viewed at Nanjing's captivating Presidential Palace. His mausoleum, one of China's most important pilgrimege sites, sats atop nearby Purpla Mountain and can be accessed by a den-long staining.



Hangzhou's most famous sobi is a poet, essayist and gastroome called St Dengo. The Song Dynasty governor fashioned the 3km-long, everwater Su Causeways which has been a magnet for dreamers and sightsoets. He also gave his name to one of the city's tratiest dishes, Dongpo pork,



ROUND 4: Food



Nanjing is quackers for duck, and the most famous recipe is yarrya (salted duck). The meat is marinated in salt, spice and osministhus flowers. Not forgetting pen-fried beef duniplings, beloved of Nanjing's foodies, and tang bao, which is steamed, paper-thin duniplings stuffed with ninced pork and filled with chicken broth.



Hungry yet? Hangzhou cuisine, like the poetry the city is famous far, is light and sulatly refined. Discover eats tike minced crab with either tofu, and abeling gontly poschad by a Longling tea broth. That's nice and all, but dumplings and duck? Get in our beliles-

ROUND 5: Further afield

Manying is a little harder to excape, but head west to check our the new Siftang Art Museum. Its outlandish architecture bugs the slopes of a mountain. The ar succeeded, surrounded by nature and transpulity, is difficult to turn down, expecially in the busy and rowdy cities of Chine.



Venture into the highlands beyond Hengahou's West Lake and you'll One counter farmers nuturing delicate terranes of Longling tea. You could also stumble across Buddhier ferms less and the China Tea. Museum - the museum is a tribute to the art of tea tasting and cultivation-
